Deciding on a topic for each group of ideas

Perhaps one of the ideas you have jotted down will be a useful heading (**topic heading**) for a group that it belongs to. These groups are your **topic groups**.

TRY IT OUT

Look at the table on page 65. This shows the notes one pair of students made in response to the essay question on page 62. The students have organised their ideas into groups (or columns).

Try to choose one phrase from each column that could make a rough title for the whole group column. For example, the first column could be headed *Personal communication* or just *Communication*.

If you cannot choose one phrase, then try to think of a word or short phrase that might sum up the column.
